



#### Reimagining Recess Concepts:

- Socially distant games that require no props, or equipment
- Conflict resolution techniques and strategies (student to adult and student to student)
- Incorporates teachings from AWSL's *Calling All Superheroes* Elementary SEL program
- Purposeful play and relationship-building strategies
- Discussions around the science of play
- Becoming while doing. Participants will do with the AWSL facilitators and will be active during the training

Calling All Superheroes is a school-wide elementary program offered online or through socially-distant platforms. The program aligns with Washington State and CASEL social-emotional learning standards to provide dynamic, multi-faceted tier-one opportunities for schools and communities.

Complete with exciting modules, songs, stories, and a parent and family engagement guide. *Calling all Superheroes* is the perfect program

for all elementary schools. *Calling All Superheroes* is FREE with AWSL membership!

#### **Lesson Format:**

- Learning modules designed to promote school-wide climate, enhance classroom culture, and provide brain breaks for students!


Parent/Booster/ Support groups are extremely important in supporting students. But navigating the school public finance world (our job) with private money (the booster groups) can

James Layman, all in a format that lets you customize the program to fit your school day. Engage your students in the ideas of leadership, personal stories, and humanity.



#### Starting in the Middle

#### **Category: Publication**



The second edition of *Starting in the Middle* has been rewritten and redesigned as a resource book for teaching leadership concepts to middle-level students. In addition to 84 brand-new and revamped lessons for formal and informal classrooms, a section of "20 for 20" contains twenty-minute lessons designed for school-wide use in advisory or homeroom settings. Also included are resources for structuring a middle-level student leadership

program, aligning leadership instruction to standards, workshop/large group icebreakers, and organizational tools.

#### **Fall Leadership Days**

#### **Category: Program**



Regional, day-long workshops equip students with skills and ideas to understand themselves and their futures and to lead in their schools. Fall Leadership Days are rooted in the principles of "Who am 1?" "Who are

we?" "Where do we want to go?" How do we get there?"

Workshop topics include improving school climate, leader responsibility, team building, project planning, school engagement strategies, and an interactive idea exchange!

#### **Middle-Level Regionals**

Middle-Level Regionals are one-day leadership workshops designed to introduce younger students to the world of leading themselves and their school community while energizing emerging and established



leaders for the end of the year. MLRs will occur at regional locations throughout the state in February and March!

#### Middle-Level Team Retreat

The Team Retreat allows schools to train and unite their leadership team and program. The leadership training is designed to increase a school's teamwork skills and explore relevant leadership concepts, including:



- Equipping students with skills and ideas to understand themselves and their futures, and to lead in their schools.
- Creating a culture, Ensuring School Safety, and Engaging the School Community.
- Assembly techniques, crowd involvement, and leadership styles.

The Team Retreat occurs at the Cispus Learning Center (Western Washington) and Camp Reed (Eastern Washington).



#### **Student Voice Summits**





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


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#### **Summer Residential Counselor**
